Tumanawanui Māori & Pasifika Wāhine Kaupapa Te Mangai Ārahi 2021-2022 (Women in Justice Sector Mentoring Programme)

Tumanawanui “Strength to Stand Strong” is a mentoring programme that was developed with Mana Whenua represented by Whaea Pare Rauwhero and Matua Brownie Rauwhero and first launched in June 2019. This programme was made up of 20 Kaiārahi (mentor) and Kaitautoko (mentee) from Police, Corrections, Ministry of Justice and Oranga Tamariki from the Counties Manukau area, who were matched and supported to engage in mentoring relationships. The Ministry of Justice funded these mentees to attend the 2019 Auckland Women in Public Sector Summit.

On 22 - 23 April 2021 approximately 80 Wāhine and a number of Tāne from Ministry of Justice, Police, Corrections and Oranga Tamariki throughout Tāmaki Makaurau came together for the second Tumanawanui programme.

All Kaiārahi and Kaitautoko will be matched and supported to begin their mentoring relationships.

The Kaitautoko will be funded by the Auckland Justice Sector Leaders Board (AJSLB) to attend the 2021 Auckland Women in Public Sector Summit in June.
