


The AGWN Quick Guide to... Political savvy

Political savvy is a critical part of system leadership but according to the SSC's <u>Leadership Insights</u>, more of our female leaders have this as a development need (47%) than male leaders (33%).

So what can we do from Auckland, 600km north of the Beehive, to develop our political savvy and our confidence in bridging that interface between government and the public sector?

96 out of 243 leaders need to develop Leading at the Political Interface

- 1. Take a tour of Parliament and see politicians in action
- 2. <u>Watch or listen</u> to Parliament live
- 3. Listen to The House on Radio NZ
- 4. Listen in on Auckland Council proceedings from the comfort of your desk through their <u>live link</u>
- 5. Attend one of the <u>free courses</u> at Parliament for public servants
- Think about how the change of government has affected your agency – building trust is key - see the 6 principles in this <u>ANZSOG resource</u>
- 7. Practice political savviness in your own agency with <u>these tips</u> on social awareness and political savviness
- 8. Consider the private sector perspective with this article
- 9. Arrange to spend a week at your agency's head office, in the policy team or in your Minister's office
